WHAT ARE THE COUNTRY'S BIGGEST PROBLEMS TODAY?



Economic issues are of most concern for the survey population



77% say the country is headed in the right direction, while **20% disagree**




Though 69% say security conditions in their communities are good, 29% say they are poor


Few worry about political tensions (1%). Similarly, extremist attacks rank low among priority concerns (1%)

ATTITUDES TOWARDS VIOLENT EXTREMISM AND GROUPS

- 13% attribute recent attacks in Côte d'Ivoire to extremist groups
- 31% point to people outside the country
- Only 1% say local ethnic groups
- Most people do not know or say "Other"
- Despite limited awareness,
 95% oppose violence against civilians for political or economic reasons

WHO CAN BEST TACKLE NATIONAL ISSUES

Non-state local actors are trusted most to address problems.



FACILITATORS OF COMMUNITY RESILIENCE

Local non-state actors are also considered the most capable for addressing community conflicts

How effective are the following at resolving disputes in our community?

Traditional Chiefs	95%	4%
Religious Leaders	89%	5%
Community Leaders	88%	7%
Police	75%	17%
Elected officials and Authorities	65%	20%
Courts	53%	20%
