

Terms of Reference for Data visualization Consultant to lead on strengthening EAI Resilience for Peace (R4P) Project in its analysis and communication capacities around the project results and performance

Background:

Equal Access International is an international not for profit organization working throughout Asia and Africa. A communication for social change organization that combines the power of media with community mobilization, Equal Access creates customized communications strategies and outreach solutions that address the most critical challenges affecting people in the developing world in the areas of peace and transforming extremism, women’s and girl’s empowerment, governance, civic participation, youth development, human rights and health. EAI is currently implementing the Resilience for Peace (R4P) US Agency for International Development (USAID) focusing on P/CVE, community resilience in Côte d’Ivoire Northern Border.

Resilience for Peace (R4P) is a five-year USAID-funded, EAI-implemented, initiative to strengthen community resilience and learning, particularly for women and youth, to counter and prevent violent extremism in Côte d’Ivoire’s northern border areas. Working with partners – National Opinion Research Center (NORC), Indigo-Côte d’Ivoire and the University of Bouaké – the project will foster a “CVE ecosystem” by reinforcing community resilience structures, creating civic and economic empowerment opportunities for at-risk border communities, through improvements in natural resource management and government-service delivery and responsiveness. Other activities will educate citizens and foster dialogue networks and townhalls to build whole-of-community trust, increase positive narratives, generate knowledge and learning among local communities on CVE concepts, while economic empowerment and positive youth development approaches will improve their employability.

R4P seeks a data visualization consultant with experience in analyzing qualitative and quantitative data, which the project has generated and documented in order to present the richness of insights through visualizations and infographics. Theses visualization will be integrated into reports to USAID, internal documents, online publications, social media and others. The audience for these visual products includes R4P, EAI headquarter, USAID, and where appropriate the public.

The Consultant is expected to participate in regular exchanges with EAI as part of the Level of Effort of the different tasks.
