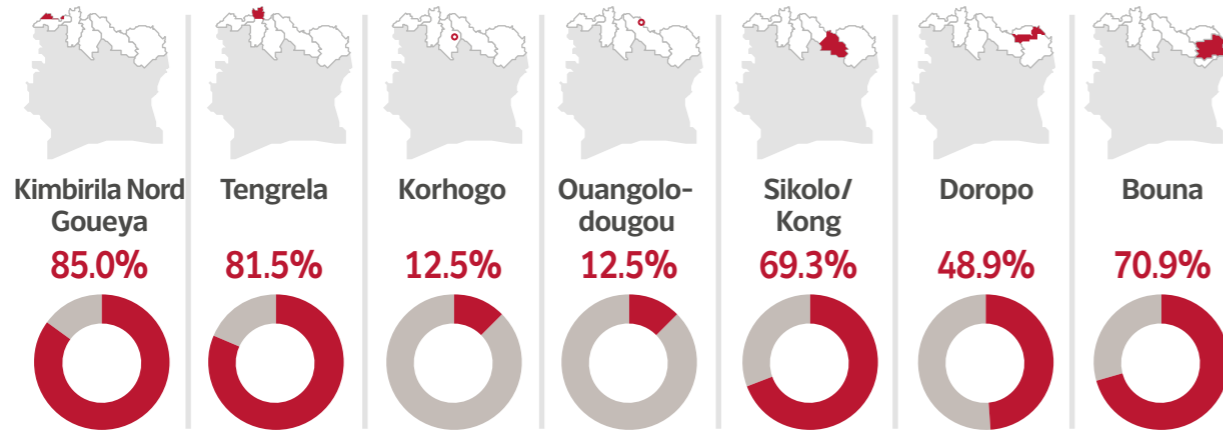
GENDERED VIEW OF COMMUNICATION IN THE NORTHERN BORDER AREAS



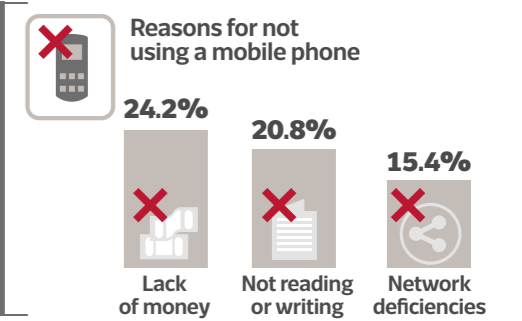
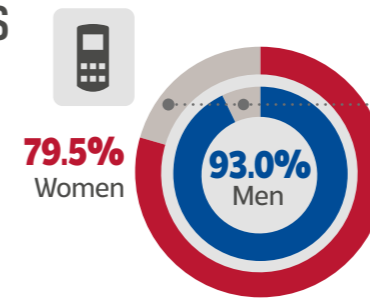

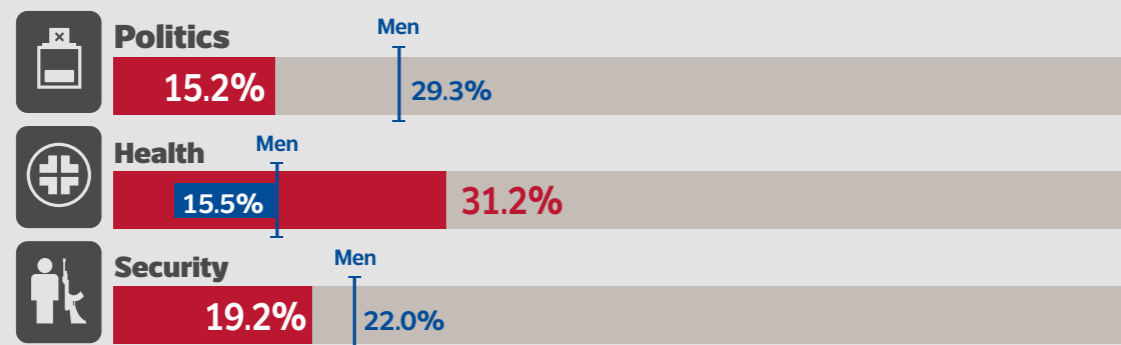

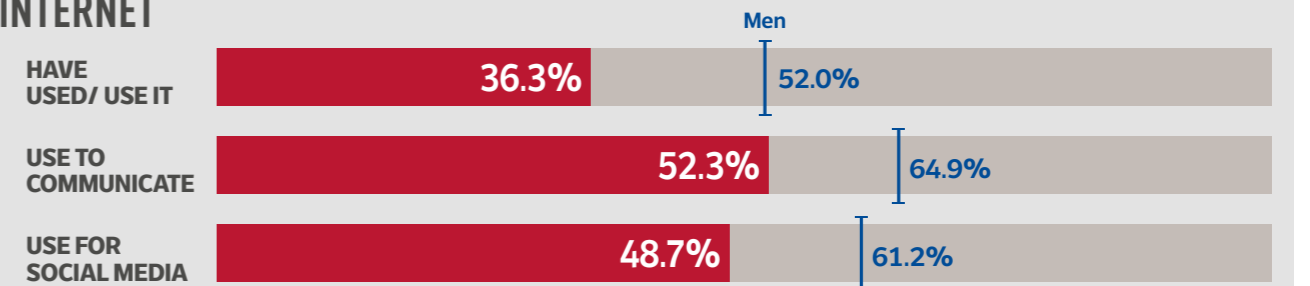

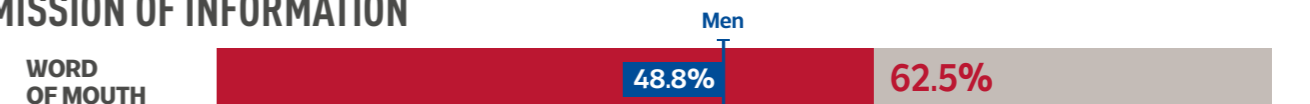

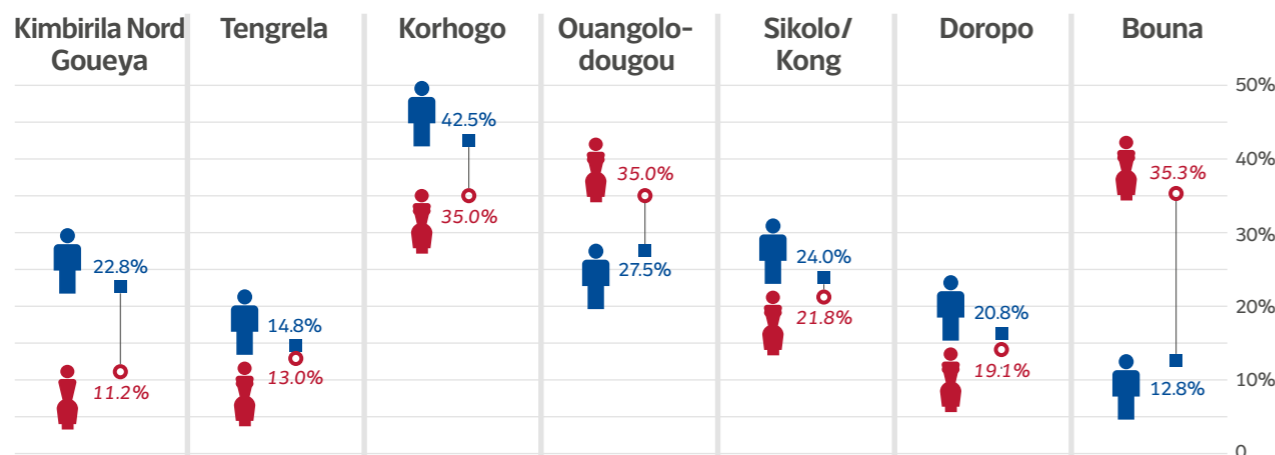

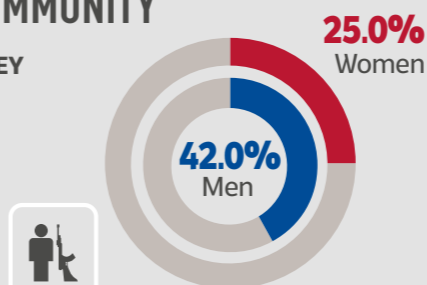

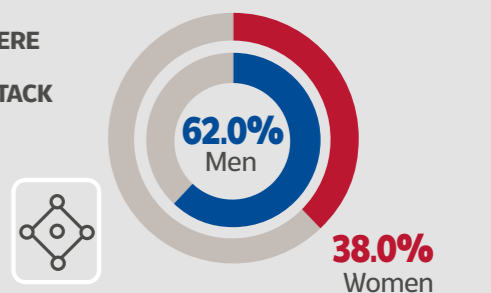
