## 1. Synopsis of the Project and Request for Quotation

Equal Access International (EAI) implements the Resilience for Peace (R4P) project, a five-year USAID-funded initiative to strengthen community resilience and prevent violent extremism in Côte d'Ivoire's northern border areas. Working with the International Rescue Committee (IRC) and Indigo-Côte d'Ivoire, the project fosters a "Countering Violent Extremism (CVE) ecosystem" by reinforcing community resilience structures. The project facilitates civic and economic empowerment opportunities for at-risk border communities, including women and youth; enables an inclusive network of CVE researchers, practitioners and influencers; and integrates learning to better identify pockets of vulnerability. The project also increases positive narratives through its partnership with 12 local radio stations and local influencers.

R4P produces research and other documents in French that need to be translated into English. The work for this contract is anticipated from July 1, 2024 to August 31, 2025

R4P estimates needing translation for approximately 12 reports that can be up to 40 pages each.

<p>11. Determination of Responsibility</p>	<p>EAI will not enter into any type of agreement with a vendor prior to ensuring the vendor’s responsibility. ## 1.1 Attachment A: Scope of Work

### **Background:**

Equal Access International (EAI) – a non-governmental organization (NGO) headquartered in Washington, D.C. – partners with communities around the world to co-create sustainable solutions utilizing community engagement and participatory media and technology. With funding from bilaterals, multi-laterals, foundations, and individual donors, EAI has a 20-year record of accomplishment implementing social change projects in Afghanistan, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Chad, Côte d’Ivoire, Kenya, Mali, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, and the Philippines.

Equal Access International (EAI) seeks an experienced consultant to provide outstanding French to English translation.

In February 2021, EAI began implementing Resilience for Peace (R4P), a five-year project aimed at strengthening community resilience and learning, particularly for youth and women, to counter violent extremism (CVE) in Côte d’Ivoire’s (CIV) northern border areas with funding from the United States Agency for International Development (USAID).

### **General Description**

The R4P project is carried out through February 2026 and needs translation services for public-facing materials produced in French, such as research reports.

Between July 2024 and August 2025, EAI anticipates needing translation for eight to 12 research reports, that can be about 40 pages each.

### **Objectives**

- Provide excellent French to English translation of complex research reports

### **Expected Deliverables:**

- Research reports in English
- Other documents as needed

### **Expertise**

- Proven French to English translation experience
- Fluency in French and in English required, native English speaker preferred
- Experience related to West Africa, and topics relevant to the research (violent extremism, conflict, peacebuilding, gender, etc.)
